Omaha, Nebraska, was founded in 1854 and named after an American Indian Tribe with its naming translating to "those going against the wind or current". Today, Omaha boasts being the 42nd largest city in the nation with over 900,000 people. Population Growth & New Developments: Omaha has grown over 13% in population since 2000.** According to Visit Omaha, more than \$8 billion has been invested into new developments. Furthermore: "In recent years, the Omaha riverfront and downtown area have experienced tremendous growth with over two billion dollars in new development. A one-of-a-kind \$22 million pedestrian bridge S-curves its way across the Missouri River, the signature, cable-stayed Bob Kerrey Bridge is one of the longest pedestrian bridge projects ever constructed, giving Omaha visitors a breathtaking view of the ever-changing skyline."***




Education, Transportation & Accessibility: The city is home to the University of Nebraska (UNO) with approx. 15,000 students and Division 1 athletics and the private Jesuit institution, Creighton University, with approx. 8,000 students and Division 1 athletics. Other educational institutions in Omaha include Clarkson College, College of St. Mary, Grace University, Metro Community College, Nebraska Methodist and the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Interstates 80 and 29 run through the city that features Eppley Airfield, which has over 200 arrivals and departures daily. Omaha also offers a mass transit bus system called Omaha Metro.***




Arts, Culture & Entertainment: Omaha is known for its over-60-year-old-tradition of hosting the NCAA Men's College Baseball World Series as well as being home to the world-renowned Henry Doorly Zoo & Aquarium.
